FILM SOCIETY

Our next two film shows have been arranged specially for all those people who normally can't attend on Wednesdays. They will take place on Mondays, the first on Monday 9th December at 6.30 p.m. featuring M*A*S*H*.

This film was made in the U.S.A. in 1969 and directed by Robert Altman. It has been hailed as the great anti-everything film without actually saying what its' against. MASH (Mobile Army Surgical Hospital) sets out unashamedly to entertain and is wildly, irreverently and blasphemously funny. The message it delivers is that people should do their thing (in this film, be good surgeons) and try to suppress or ignore all hindrances (in this case, discipline and regulations).

The Army or the Establishment comes out badly in this film because all authority is shown to be useless, irrelevant and even damaging, since the medical unit operates at maximum efficiency until any attempt is made to intervene on behalf of red tape and regulations. One of the assumptions behind the film is that girl-chasing, beer-swilling, rag-loving medical students do not all suddenly become staid Dr. Gillespies the day they graduate.
