

**BICC Wood Lane
Reunion news and gossip - Summer 2011**

A total of 53 people attended the 2011 reunion at The Bull in the Westfield Centre at Shepherds Bush on Friday 20th May. A full listing, including the recorded apologies, is attached.




By contrast **Chris White** and **Alan Hopkins** seem disinterested – unless they had got there first!!

Another historical note was struck by **Michael Fox**, who had found a piece of the 1974 plan to have a terminal for the channel tunnel just to the north of our site. The abstracted piece below shows the site and the railway lines, with new lines in a heavier ink veering away at the left-hand side towards the proposed terminal.



The work was abandoned in 1975 when the government started to make cutbacks in the face of economic pressures, but much of the overall planning, including the tunnel borings that had started, found use in the eventual successful scheme. The railway line by our site was eventually used as an access line from the depot at North Pole Junction to and from Waterloo.
